In recent months, I have been deeply encouraged by the very real progress Congress has made to enable greater access to U.S. minerals. The Senate passed Energy and Natural Resource Committee Chairman Lisa Murkowski's (R-Alaska) "Energy Policy Modernization Act of 2016" in April and just before summer recess, they voted to form a conference committee with the House of Representatives on proposed energy bills. The House passed energy bill, called the "North American Energy Security and Infrastructure Act" will also be brought to the table when the conference committee convenes this fall.

These bills are part of an effort to ensure that America remains a leader in minerals production. Mining has long been a U.S. economic engine, but current regulations have created a process that is redundant and burdensome. As a result, it can take up to 10 years to get a mining permit.

Our nation is home to an estimated \$6.2 trillion worth of mineral resources, and we can't afford to tie up those resources with bureaucracy. The minerals mined in the U.S. are used in a variety of applications that touch our everyday lives and even contribute to national security.
